Thoughts on Our Theme

Dear Parents,

The psalmist prays, and we join with him: "One thing I ask of the Lord, that will I seek after; that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in His temple" (Ps 27:4).

Easter, the day of our Lord's resurrection, is a reminder to us that we have on earth no lasting city. Our time here is brief – for some a few days, others several years, still others 70, 80, or 90. In comparison to eternity, forever, this time on earth is but a drop in the bucket! And yet we must remember the purpose of these years: to glorify the Lord, to be in communion with Him now so as to be with Him forever- to choose heaven on the way to heaven. Our salvation has already been bought for us at the price of Christ's Blood; this we know to be true. Yet still the gift is not imposed upon us; Jesus does not force us into heaven; it must be accepted and chosen NOW.

What does "seeking to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of our life" look like? Here we turn to St. Mary Magdalene on Easter morning (ref. Jn 20:11-18). She is seeking her Lord. She sits outside the tomb weeping, because she believes someone has taken Jesus' body away. She does not realize that He IS there, not dead, but alive! Sometimes we forget that He is HERE. She actively seeks Him, do we? "Women, why are you weeping? Whom do you seek?" (Jn 20:15). She pleads with Jesus when she supposes him to be a gardener. And oh the joyous moment when He calls her by name: "Mary" (Jn 20:10). The veil is lifted, and she recognized the Lord – JOY!

Sacred Scripture reminds us, "I have called you by name, you are Mine" (Is 43:1). To seek Him means to be both active and receptive. We must listen for His voice which speaks to us first and foremost when we receive His very Body and Blood at Mass each Sunday. He speaks to us in Scripture. We hear His voice in prayer and in the conviction of our conscience: "Seek good and not evil" (Amos 5:19). He speaks to us through the Church, which he established for us, not leaving us orphans. His ways are not earthly, but heavenly. We must seek Him and then listen.

Preparation to live in the house of the Lord all the days of our life begins NOW! The journey is at times taxing and bumpy, but so was His. It will involve suffering and persecution, but so did His. It is a battle of good against evil, but He has already won the victory. Yes, heaven begins on earth. One of the third graders wrote this prayer:

Now I lay down in Your hands
which are filled with joy and peace.
You comfort me; You keep me warm
You talk of Joy.
You are the Son of God.

Let us pray for one another that in every choice we make, big or small, we might be choosing heaven. That as the Son of God calls each of us by name, we might say, *Wherever You go Lord, I will follow*. That with His grace and our "Yes", we may gaze upon the beauty of the Lord not veiled as in this world for 70, 80, or 90 years, but face to face for eternity.

St. Pius V

Born: 1504 Died: 1574

Feast Day: April 30th

This holy pope was born at Bosco in Italy to noble Italian parents. He was baptized Anthony Ghislieri. Because his family lost their wealth and became poor, his parents had no money to send him to school. It seemed as though Anthony's dream to become a priest, would never come true. Then one day, two Dominican priests visited their home and met Anthony. They liked him so much that they offered to educate him.

Anthony received an excellent education. He also became very pious and holy. So at the age of fourteen, Anthony joined the Dominican order. That is when he took the name "Michael." He finally became a priest, and was appointed a teacher of philosophy and divinity (religion) in Genoa.

He traveled for sixteen years to the many Dominican houses teaching them how to live for God. Then he was made bishop and later a cardinal. He continued teaching his people how to live a holy life by his words and example.

He bravely defended the teachings of the Church against those who fought against them. He lived a life of penance and sacrifice. When he was sixty-one, he was chosen pope and took the name Pope Pius V.

He had once been a poor shepherd boy. Now he was the head of the whole Catholic Church. Yet he remained as humble as ever and still wore his white Dominican habit, the same old one he had always worn. No one could make him change it.

As pope, Pius V had many challenges to face, he drew strength from the crucifix. He reflected every day on the sufferings and death of Jesus. At this time, the Turks were trying to conquer and take over the whole Christian world. They had a great navy on the Mediterranean Sea.

Christian soldiers went to battle against them at a place called Lepanto, near Greece. From the moment the army set out, the pope prayed the Rosary and asked the people to do the same. Thanks to the help of the Blessed Mother, the Christians won a great victory. In gratitude and thanksgiving to Mary, St. Pius V established the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary which we celebrate each year on October 7. As pope, he started many new seminaries (colleges for priests) and wrote many church documents to guide the people. He spent much time looking after the poor with money from the church wealth and building hospitals for the sick. Pope Pius V died in Rome on May 1, 1572.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

We are very excited about supplementing our religious education in the school for the upcoming school year with Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS). As you may know, the parish has been using this program for several years now, and the location of the Atrium is the building that used to be the Lourdes Marian Center. Students in Kindergarten through 2nd grade will visit the Atrium for religion instruction once a week. Mrs. Mary Donelson who has been trained in CGS will be the instructor in the Atrium. The following is more background information about Catechesis of the Good Shepherd from the CGS Center for Training (<http://www.goodshepherdcatechesis.com/id1.html>)

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is an approach to the religious formation of children that is based on the conviction that God and the Child are in relationship. Our role as adults is to protect and nurture this bond. In the Catechesis we present age-appropriate themes from the Bible and our liturgy with manipulative materials the children use to internalize and ponder the great mysteries of our faith.

- *We try to put the child in touch with those "sources" through which God reveals and communicates Himself in living form; namely, the Bible and Liturgy, in balanced proportion. (Rebekah Rojcewicz, RPOC, p.28)*

Developed by Sofia Cavalletti, an Italian Hebrew scripture scholar, building on the work and methods of Maria Montessori, the Catechesis seeks to give children the guidance and vocabulary which enable them to become aware of their relationship with God and give expression to it. With the Catechesis we help each child to continue to fall in love with God while building community among peers.

- *[The atrium] is a place where the child comes to know the great realities of...life as a Christian, but also and above all, a place where the child begins to live these realities in meditation and prayer. There is nothing of the academic classroom about the atrium; it is not a place for religious instruction but religious life. (Sofia Cavalletti, RPOC, p. 56)*

Wellness Clinic






